UConn Early College Experience & Tunxis College Career Pathways Registration Evening – May 15, 2014





Students at Berlin High School now have the opportunity to obtain both high school and college credit through two different college credit programs:

The Early College Experience program, run through the University of Connecticut, is an opportunity for students to take UConn courses while still in high school. Berlin High School will offer 15 UConn ECE courses to its students for the 2014-2015 school year. These courses are taught by our own Berlin High School teachers who have been certified as adjunct faculty of the University of Connecticut.

UConn Early College Experience (ECE) is a concurrent enrollment program that allows motivated high school students to take UConn courses at their high schools for both high school and college credit. Every course taken through UConn ECE is equivalent to the same course at the University of Connecticut. Students are expected to maintain a "C" average and pass a university assessment to receive college credit.

The Tunxis College Career Pathways (CCP) is a collaborative Dual Credit program between area high schools and Tunxis Community College. It is designed to allow high school students to sample the rigor of college academics, and possibly earn college credit, while attending high school.

A Career Pathway is a series of courses that CCP students in their junior and senior year commit to taking in high school. Each pathway includes a designated math course, English/speech course, science course and a course or courses in a career area. The CCP courses meet the same level of rigor taught at the Tunxis Community College level. Students earn "dual credit" (credit from their high school and credit from TCC) provided they maintain a 75 average and pass a college department level assessment.

On Thursday, May 15th from 7-9pm in the high school cafeteria, Mrs. Ramirez will be holding an information and registration evening for those students and their parents who have signed up for either UConn courses or a series of courses related to Tunxis's College Career Pathway programming through the scheduling process. 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Important Information for all Students

- As we enter the 4th quarter, it is so important to do your very best to finish the school year successfully.
- Seniors need to bear in mind that allowing senioritis to creep in can be detrimental if grades decline, especially since colleges/universities are looking for final transcripts.
- It is important for all students to pay attention to the attendance policy since credit can be denied if you are over the allotted number per full and half year courses. Tardies are also averaged into absences; for every 2 tardies, it equals 1 absence added to the total number of overall absences.
- As the weather gets warmer over the next few months, please pay close attention to the student dress code and dress appropriately for school.

Attention Juniors

Grade 11 college-bound students should plan to take the SATs at Berlin High School either on May 3 or June 7. Students can still register under the "late" deadline for the May SATs by April 21^{th.} The registration for the June SATs is May 9th. The cost for the SAT is \$51.

Registration should be completed online by going to www.sat.collegeboard.org/register. When students register online they receive immediate confirmation and a test center assignment. Students MUST upload a photo onto their admissions ticket or they will not be admitted into the test site. They may print or make corrections on their admissions ticket as well. The high school code for BHS is: 070020. The test center code is: 07-115

Most colleges and universities, as well as the NCAA Clearinghouse require that official SAT scores be sent to them directly by College Board. When students register online, they are allowed to choose up to four schools to receive their scores from College Board at no cost.

If this is not done during registration or if more schools need scores sent, an additional fee is required. **SAT scores** will not be printed on the BHS transcript.
