Important Events For Grades 8-11

2014-2015 Course Registration

From February 28 - March 13th, students in grades 8-11 should be registering for their course requests online through Power School.

Teachers have made recommendations for students based on common assessments, performance in class,



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and understanding and skill with regard to subject

matter. If students and their parents are not in agreement with the teacher's recommendation, an override form can be submitted once a consultation with the teacher takes place. Override Forms must be submitted before April 12th. If students experience difficulty registering for their courses, they should contact their counselor for assistance.

CAPT and SBAC Testing

In order to receive a Berlin High School diploma all students must show mastery in Reading, Writing, Mathematics and Science. One way for students to demonstrate mastery in Science is by scoring a level of "Goal" or "Advanced" on the Science CAPT. On Thursday, March 13th and Friday, March 14th, all 9th grade students will be given the practice Science CAPT, which will be scored and analyzed by our Science teachers, and all 10th grade students will be given the live Science CAPT.

11th grade students who scored Below Basic, Basic or Proficient on the Science CAPT during the 2012-2013 school year will be retested; these students have already been notified.

During the week of March 24th, all juniors will be taking the Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium test, or SBAC, which is a state-led assessment for English language arts/literacy and mathematics aligned to the Common Core State Standards, which has been designed to measure the college and career readiness of our students. A schedule will be provided.

Important Messages

Seniors:

As we approach the end of the 3rd Marking Period and begin the 4th Marking period, it is very important to refrain from falling into the trap of <u>Senioritis</u>. Senioritis is defined in the Merriam-Webster Dictionary as, "an ebbing of motivation and effort by high school seniors as evidenced by tardiness, absences, and lower grades." College acceptance letters have been coming in and many of you will begin to think about the transition you will make as a college student. Senioritis can jeopardize this future opportunity! College acceptances are not set in stone and there have been occasions when colleges have denied acceptances due to students who have allowed their grades to slip. Don't let this happen to you! Continue to work hard and keep up your grades through the 4th Marking Period!

Additionally, please pay very close attention to your attendance! You can be denied credit due to absences if you go over the limit.

Juniors: Things to Think About -

- Am I giving my best to Junior course work?
- Am I taking courses that lead to my post high school plans?
- With which teachers have I established a strong rapport? (Potential college/job letters of recommendation).
- Which talents or strengths might I want to further develop through college studies or post high school plans?
- Which activities will I highlight on my college/job application?
- Have I reviewed my senior course schedule with both my parents and my counselor?

Sophomores: Things to Think About -

- In which subjects did I excel?
- Am I taking courses that lead to my post high school plans?
- Am I giving my best to sophomore courses?
- Of my unique talents and strengths, which would I most like to develop?
- Am I involved in at least one extra-curricular activity or community service?
- What potential career/post high school option have I considered?
